

Methodology

- Questions prepared by Inside Higher Ed, in collaboration with Hanover Research.
- Polling conducted in July/August.
- 239 admissions leaders responded; 100 public,
 134 private nonprofit; nationally representative.
- Complete anonymity for respondents, but answers coded to allow for breakdown by sector, geography, etc.










The End of Affirmative Action

To what extent do you oppose or support the recent Supreme Court decision on affirmative action? (n=224)






Effect on Admissions Policies

Will the decision result in changes in your institution's admissions policies?




Readiness for Change

Impact on Financial Aid Policies






New Essay Prompts


More Dissonance?

Is your institution considering a plan to admit significantly more transfer students as part of a response to the decision?




State Policy Solutions

Removing Barriers to Equity


Does your institution grant any degree of preference to legacy applicants? (n=237)



Eliminating Legacy Admissions


To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement: Institutions should grant some degree of preference to legacy applicants over non-legacy applicants.






Test-Optional: The New Normal




Success of Test-Optional Policies



Racial Diversity Impacts of Test-Optional




Socioeconomic Diversity Impacts of Test Optional




Growing Enrollment Challenges

Thinking back, please indicate how concerned you were about meeting your institution's new student enrollment goals this year, that is, for the class enrolling in Fall 2023: (n=239)




Meeting Enrollment Goals




Optimism or Denial?
