


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The National Transfer Landscape – Chances of Success

CCRC

Few Transfer, Even Fewer Complete

The National Transfer Landscape – Credit Loss

— CCRC

Transfer Credit Loss



Just **58%** of students successfully transferred 90% of their credits.



And **15%** can't transfer any credits at all.



Students who can transfer 90% of their credits were **2.5x** more likely to get their bachelor's degree, compared to those who transfer half or less.

Methodology

- Questions prepared by *Inside Higher Ed*, in collaboration with Hanover Research.
- Polling conducted by Hanover in September/October.
- 143 administrators involved in transfer process or policy; 120 at 4-year colleges, 23 at 2-year colleges.


Approximately what proportion of transfer students [to/from] your institution perform worse, the same, or better than students who began their academic careers [there/at the transfer institution]?




Effectiveness in Managing the Transfer Process

4-year private (n=67) 4-year public (n=53) 2-year public (n=23)




Effectiveness in Managing the Transfer Process (cont.)

4-year private (n=65) 4-year public (n=49) 2-year public (n=23)




Perceptual Gap on Credit Approval Process



A more centralized approach to credit evaluation works better for transfer student enrollment.

Faculty experts in individual academic departments are effective at deciding which and how many credits students may transfer to a major program.*



Biggest Concerns About Transfer Students


- **Success in an online environment** is a worry for half or more of 2-year and 4-year college administrators.
- **Inability to afford tuition** is a concern for $\frac{3}{4}$ of officials at community colleges and more than half of those at 4-year private colleges, but just 39% of those at four-year publics.
- **Difficulty of credit transfer process** troubles 60% of community college officials but only a third of four-year college administrators. **Failure to apply credits to a major** of more concern to two-year than four-year officials.
- Community college administrators more likely than four-year peers to be concerned about **lack of social integration**, and twice as likely to worry about transfer students' **difficulty finding support services**.

Policies in Place for Transfer Students, Pre-COVID

- 93% of public 4-year college respondents said they had **aligned academic curriculums** with local 2-year colleges; about 2/3 of private 4-year institutions said the same.
- 57% of 4-year colleges and 44% of private colleges said they had **direct admissions programs** for 2-year college students.
