<u>Methodology</u>

- Survey conducted by Gallup in January-February 2014
- Responses from 846 campus chief executives
- Gallup estimates 95 percent confidence level of margin of error of 3.4 percentage points on overall results, with slightly higher margins for subsets of the survey population.
- Responses were coded to allow for analysis by sector of some questions.
- Complete anonymity for individuals and institutions.



Key Findings

- Half of presidents say it is appropriate for U.S. government to report data on career and other outcomes of graduates.
 Just 13% are confident data will be accurately collected.
- Many more CEOs say institutions should report various student outcomes than say they actually do.
- Half of presidents are confident about sustainability of their institution's financial model over the next 10 years.
- 7 in 10 presidents agree that colleges must improve how they respond to allegations of sexual assault on campus.
- Majority of presidents (90 percent) say state of race relations on campus is generally good.

Student Outcomes and the Feds



Significant variation by sector/segment view of "appropriateness" of federal role:

Strongly Agree/Agree	50%	60%	34%	63%
Disagree/ Strongly Disagree	27%	18%	38%	16%

 9% of private college leaders and 16% of public CEOs said government has a "good chance" of collecting and reporting accurately on higher education outcomes.

Finances and the Future

 5% strongly agree (17% agree) that 2008 downturn is "effectively over" at their institution;
 54% disagree or strongly disagree.



- 18% agree that "reports that a significant number of higher education institutions are facing existential financial crisis are overblown"; 60 percent disagree.
- Six in 10 CEOs confident in "sustainability" of financial model over five years; 50% over 10 years. For-profit leaders most optimistic (70%), then public master's and doctoral institutions (56 and 53%), community college presidents (44%) and private baccalaureate colleges (45%).
- 53% of presidents say new spending will come from reallocated \$\$ rather than increase in net revenue.

Scrutiny for Sexual Assault Policies

- 95 percent of presidents agree or strongly agree that their institution handles allegations appropriately.
- 73 percent of public presidents and 66 percent of private presidents believe higher education generally needs to "improve" its response to sexual assault charges.
- 21 percent of presidents believe athletes are less likely than other students to be held accountable.



The Israel Boycott Movement

- 6 percent of presidents favor the stance of the American Studies Association (which has called for a boycott of Israeli universities).
- 18 percent of presidents say it is "generally helpful" for disciplinary groups to share their views on world affairs.
