Replicated Text Detection: Test of TurnItIn March 2015

Test Method

As in 2007, I surveyed library staff and writing instructors and assembled six test essays replicating sources common to humanities, natural sciences, and fine arts undergraduate classes. This is not intended to be an entirely representative sample; however, it does accurately reflect the kinds of sources students have used and misused (intentionally or not) in UT classes. These are the source areas we are most concerned that a plagiarism detector be able to find quickly, accurately, and reliably. These results do not address the problem of collusion between students.

Results

TurnItIn's performance has not improved since our 2007 test. It has gotten slightly better at detecting certain types of sites, but still misses some surprisingly high-profile web sources. It is also relatively easy to fool via translations and modest textual re-arrangement.

Usability

TurnItIn's instructor interface has changed since 2007 but have not necessarily improved. The system still requires significantly more training and hands-on instructor time than Google. The recommended Google detection method—selecting word strings containing three to five nouns —can be taught in a 30-minute training session. Google also produces far fewer false negatives than TurnItIn, provides easier to understand results, honors FERPA requirements, and is free.
