

**American College Counseling Association – Community College Task Force
Survey of Community/2 Year College Counseling Services
2012-2013**

Purpose:

The American College Counseling Association's (ACCA) Community College Task Force (CCTF) has completed a 3rd national survey. The purpose of this survey is to gather benchmark data about common practices for personal/mental health counseling in community/2 Year colleges, to help in determining how many Community/2 Year colleges have trained counselors providing career counseling.

Method:

The survey was constructed with questions formulated from last year's survey and items generated from current members of the ACCA Community College Task Force, and ACCA Executive Board. The survey was implemented using SurveyMonkey.com. The survey was distributed to a compiled list of Community Colleges around the United States as well as the ACCA, Texas College Counseling Association, and the Georgia College Counseling Discussion listservs.

Professional counselors who provide personal counseling in a Community College setting were invited to respond to the survey. If there were no Counseling Services on campus, the appropriate Dean or Vice President was invited to respond (to Section I only). The response rate for email invitations was 125 out of 696. The listserv response rate was 73. Three reminders were sent to all potential participants between 11/8/12 and 1/28/13. The survey was closed to new responses on 3/12/13.

When multiple responses were received from an institution, only one response set was chosen for inclusion with the overall results. The omission criteria were approved by the ACCA Community College Task Force Chair. (n=34 omitted, 7 of which were duplicate responses from the same individuals). This was done in service of increasing the generalizability of the results.

Two iPod Shuffles were raffled off to interested participants as a response incentive.

N=198 counted responses.

Limitations:

The survey was not completed by all who were specifically invited to participate via email. The compiled list of Community Colleges around the United States may not have been exhaustive. The overall response rate was not possible to calculate because the total number of professional counselors at Community Colleges on each listserv noted above is an unknown factor.

Highlights:

This survey represents 198 Community/2 Year Colleges from 43 different states.

Response highlights:

- 73% of responding Community/2 Year Colleges provide mental health counseling services.
- For Community/2 Year Colleges that do not provide services, 22% have outsourced services by contract and 22% immediately refer student to off-campus providers.
- 78% of respondents hold Master's Degrees.
- 51% hold licensure as an LMHC/LPC or equivalent and 18% hold no licensure. 28% are National Certified Counselors.
- 38% earn a salary of \$41K to \$60K. 37% earn of salary of 61K to 80K.
- 52% are not required to hold independent state licensure.
- 86% have no on-site Psychiatry resource.

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- The Gallagher Survey of College Counseling Center Directors reports that 57% of schools do have on-campus Psychiatry (Gallagher, 2012).
- 49% do not limit the number of Counseling sessions.
 - The Gallagher Survey reports that 48% of schools do not have a session limit policy (Gallagher, 2012).
- 78% report having a Threat Assessment Team on campus.
- 20% of colleges have a dedicated staff member to provide student case management.
- 13% do not use any form of online tools to reach students. Of those that do, 80% use their colleges website/home page.
- 62% offer suicide prevention programming or resources.
- 67% describe the intensity/severity of clinical issues, relative to past years, as “Higher Severity.”
 - The Gallagher Survey reports that 88% of directors report that the recent trend toward greater number of students with severe psychological problems continues to be true on their campuses and 44% of their clients have severe psychological problems (Gallagher, 2012).
- Most common responses regarding utilization of Counseling Services:
 - *Average number of sessions per academic year* = 3 – 5
 - *Average weekly caseload size* = 83% of respondents report a caseload size of up to 20 clients a week.
 - *Percentage of student body seen for Counseling* = 58% see between 1 % and 10%.
- 76% provide mental health counseling and other services in the same office.
- Most services are available during the weekday business hours of 8am-5pm.
- 44% say “We welcome a combination of crisis and general walk-ins” for counseling.
- 84% do not provide on-call or after-hours emergency coverage.
- 56% type or handwrite their counseling notes and statistical tracking.
- 72% of colleges have trained counselors providing career counseling.
- 98% have regular duties/roles in addition to personal counseling. The top 4 are:
 - Committee work (80%)
 - Career counseling (62%)
 - Academic advising (57%)
 - Psychoeducational Programming (64%)
- The top 4 student presenting problems are:
 - Depression
 - Anxiety disorders
 - Stress
 - Relational issues

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- The last question of the survey asked respondents to share additional information. A brief summary of the response themes follows:
 - A continuing theme is one of fiscal pressure negatively affecting the availability and quality of services for students. Many Counseling Centers are under-resourced and under-staffed.
 - Many Counseling Centers are providing a variety of services to students and have limited time for Personal Counseling.
 - Counselors often “wear too many hats” and suffer from role overload.
 - Some counselors get mixed messages from the college’s administration about how to help students in distress.
 - Some colleges have recently added services to respond to the growing need, while others are under increasing pressure to refer students out for mental health care.
 - Referring students to off-campus services tends to be problematic due to college policies, student health insurance, and lack of community resources. There is also a perceived increase in students lacking access to social services.
 - Counseling Services on Community Colleges continues to be a mixture of philosophies and structures across the United States.
 - The top three concerns of students in community/2year colleges appear to be depression, anxiety disorders, and stress.
