## University Place Promenade Petition to Chancellor Syverud May 6, 2016

We the undersigned members of the Syracuse University faculty are greatly concerned about the proposed conversion of University Place into a "Promenade" and the relocation of all bus and other vehicular traffic to Waverly Avenue.

We are concerned at the lack of discussion and transparency in the decision-making process that has led to this drastic remaking of two streets that are the main thoroughfares of Syracuse University on either side of several buildings, including the Newhouse School, Schine Student Center and Bird Library.

We are concerned that no broad input was gathered from faculty or staff, and student input was gathered in a hasty and methodologically unsound manner, at the end of the semester when students are distracted by a thousand other demands.

We are concerned about the cost of this effort, given the many other more important demands on the university's budget, and that precious resources (some garnered through the Voluntary Separation Incentive Program for staff) are being spent on aesthetics with no discernable academic purpose.

We are concerned that the Promenade with its concrete furniture with embedded LED lights and heated sidewalks will perhaps not enhance the student experience, and will in fact only be used sparingly as a Promenade throughout much of the year, given Central New York weather conditions.

We are concerned that Waverly (already narrowed down to accommodate parking and a bike lane) will be choked further with the extra traffic of approximately 250 Centro buses a day, and will become even more dangerous to walkers, bike riders, and people with disabilities, as well as a source of frustration to all those drivers who seek to navigate it.

We are concerned about accessibility issues for people in wheelchairs, on crutches, and otherwise impaired who will be forced to get off buses on Waverly, and then traverse the steep University Avenue slope to access main campus buildings.

We are concerned that adding unnecessary Waverly Avenue traffic bottlenecks to future construction of the Institute for Veterans and Military Families complex on Waverly and Crouse will be intolerable.

We are concerned about the impediments to entrance and exit from Newhouse School buildings, Schine and Bird Library that will result temporarily from the construction of the

Promenade, and permanently from the changes to Waverly, and that the driveway to Quad 2 will have to be reconfigured unnecessarily.

We are concerned that the Waverly Avenue traffic bottlenecks will create a very difficult and unsafe environment for Newhouse students checking out production equipment for their academic classes from the "Cage" in the Newhouse 2 Lobby facing Waverly.

We are concerned about the impact of increased heavy traffic on the fragile web of water pipes underneath Waverly Avenue, which already break regularly.

We are concerned that the position of the City of Syracuse is a mystery, given that these are City streets and legislation will need to be changed to block University Place permanently.

As a result, we request that this project be halted so that a full campus discussion of priorities and plans for the physical environment in this area can take place, and reassessed only after the construction of the IVMF center and its impact on City roads and traffic is better known.
