

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


Methodology

- Questions prepared by *Inside Higher Ed,* in collaboration with Hanover Research.
- Polling conducted in January/February.
- 443 presidents responded; 243 public, 177 private nonprofit; 8 for-profit.
- Complete anonymity for respondents, but answers coded to allow for breakdown by sector.


Confidence Somewhat Uneven, But Across the Board

I am confident my institution will be financially stable over the next 10 years.



Adaptation and Campus Change (cont.)

- 97% agree (**62% strongly**) their institution would keep some COVID-19-related changes after the pandemic ends. (Community college presidents consistently answer higher than their peers on these questions.)
- 95% agree (65% strongly) their college "had been pushed to think outside the box in a way that will benefit the institution in the long run."
- 90% agree (46% strongly) that they'd been able to "implement some positive, long-lasting institutional changes during the pandemic."
- 82% agree (37% strongly) that "the pandemic, and subsequent necessary changes ...has created an opportunity to make other institutional changes we have been wanting to make anyway."




How Might Campuses Change?

Cultivate new donor bases	91%
Request/Lobby for additional federal and/or state support	87%
Increase grant procurement	81%
Reassess the long-term mix of in-person vs. virtual education we offer	79%
Start or expand a capital campaign	64%
Reduce academic program portfolio	39%
Reduce the institution's physical footprint	23%
Reduce extracurricular offerings	21%
Reconsider our tenure policies	14%




Modest Reckoning on Race





Outlook for the New Administration

 Presidents optimistic Biden administration will help their institutions and students. Public college more confident than private ones.



 8 in 10 say administration is likely to pursue free tuition at community colleges; 46 percent say the same about free public college.
