

What Will Happen in Florida?

Overview

The Florida Legislature passed House Bill 7 (HB 7) during the 2022 legislative session. It declares certain types of employee and student training and instruction to be discriminatory as a matter of state law. Senate Bill 2524, also passed during the 2022 legislative session, imposes large financial penalties on any university that violates the HB 7 requirements.
